Board Meeting Minutes Friends of the Lower Suwanee and Cedar Keys Wildlife Refuges 5/19/2016 Submitted by William Dummitt

Board Members Present: Libby Cagle, Roger McDaniels, Debbie Meeks, Bill Dummitt, Greg Lang, Peg Hall, Maria Sgambati, Greg Lang, John McPherson, Russ Hall (by phone)

The meeting was opened at 10 am. A motion was made by Greg Lang, seconded by Bill Dummitt to accept the minutes of the previous meeting, passed by acclamation.

John McPherson explained the new format of treasurer's report, using Quickbooks. Complete treasurer's reports are attached.

A discussion followed regarding how to best utilize the accounts and debit cards and to minimize the risk of the account being emptied if the debit card was compromised. A motion was made by Greg Lang and seconded by Peg Hall to: Create a savings account, Tie the debit card only to checking, Destroy the Paypal debit card

The motion was passed by acclamation.

Highlights of the Communications Team report by Peg Hall (complete report attached):

The Print Shop does not yet have brochures for the Tram Ridge Trail. A discussion ensued regarding service by the Print Shop and an agreement to let them know we need the service to improve.

5000 cycling brochures were printed

A Kayak to Atsena Otie brochure is in evaluation. Samples were available.

Peg noted that she wants to drop the hosting of the paddling website and redirect that link to the Friends website.

The committee is moving forward with upgrading the Friends panel on the kiosk at the Cedar Key Marina.

The Ibis went out and was opened by 43% of the 500 recipients.

The use of the Neon CRM (Customer Relationship Manager) was discussed. We would have a button on the website that would take a user to Neon, where they could join, upgrade membership, etc. Debby Meeks reported that it is easy to administer once set up, but has a significant learning curve. Should it be under communications or membership? The group agreed that it should be under membership. There was a discussion of how membership and donations are handled.

A motion was made by Maria Sgambati, seconded by Debbie Meeks to authorize the \$50/month cost of Neon and to increase the membership budget accordingly. The motion passed by acclamation.

Advocacy:

The thank you letter to the Water Board was send. No feedback has been received as yet. Greg Lang reported that the state Department of Environmental Protection has issued a water quality planning report that includes consideration of the Lower Suwanee watershed. There is, for a change, actually money available to implement improvements.

Russ Hall reported by phone on attempts so far to connect with Friends leadership at other refuges. Efforts are still in early stages.

Science initiatives:

Roger McDaniels reported that pepper busting next year will include more activity on islands. Peppers are present near Nature's Landing and Fenimore Mill.

Vista Property:

John McPherson visited with one of the sisters that own the property and toured the buildings. He is taking the first steps toward getting the property listed on the National Register of Historic Places. After seeing the interior of the house, it was clear that it should be preserved in its present condition. Other buildings on the property could be used as a visitor center.

Debbie Meeks urged more use of the Dropbox account. A motion was made by Peg Hall, seconded by John McPherson to upgrade the Dropbox account to the \$99/year level, which would give us 1 terabyte of storage. The motion passed by acclamation.

A short discussion took place regarding the board meeting in Suwanee in October. Maria suggested using a tour boat to take members to the meeting.

Board members were reminded to sign the Conflict of Interest document.

Larry Woodard arrived in time to give a refuge report:

Tram Trail brochures will be placed in a box by the trail.

The refuge will have 4 interns. Recruiting has not been well organized. Pam's presence is missed. A forestry intern started this week, paid by F&W. His name is Aaron Johnson. He will also work at St. Marks. The Nature Coast Biological Station also provided a biologist for six weeks.

Some nesting Cormorants have showed up at Seahorse Key. New rookeries have been noted at Rocky Key and Pepper Fish Key. Large numbers of nesting birds of many species still present on Snake Key.

FWC is doing acoustic research on big-eared bats on the refuge.

The refuge has backed away from any plans to manage the Lukens Tract.

July 2 will be open house at Seahorse Key.
