Board Meeting

Friends of the Lower Suwannee & Cedar Keys National Wildlife Refuges Thursday, June 19, 2014

Present:

Board Members: Russ Hall, Peg Hall, Bob McKinstry, Bob Hudson, Maria Sgambati, Bill Kilborn, John McPherson, Allan Pither, Kit Lane.

Refuge Staff: Andrew Gude.

- 1. The meeting was convened at 10:05 a.m. by Bob Hudson, Chair.
- 2. Approval of Minutes. **Motion** by Allan Pither to approve the minutes of the May 15, 2014, Board meeting as submitted. **Second** by Peg Hall. Passed by unanimous vote.
- 3. Refuge Update. Andrew Gude reported on the following:
 - a. Not a lot of burning is going on due to poor conditions.
 - b. Four Youth Conservation Corps students are working on the refuge, led by Jason and coordinated by Pam.
 - c. Pam has conducted 3 connecting kids with nature programs.
 - d. Andrew continues to work on the Tram Trail which could connect the River Trail with Fowlers Bluff. The work will include building a bridge and would highlight uplands.
 - e. A new assistant, Kimberly Sikes, has been hired at Crystal River and has freed up some of Andrew's time.
 - f. Andrew will be looking into special hunts for disabled persons and Wounded Warriors.
 - g. Andrew conveyed Kenny McCain's thanks to everyone who came to the retirement party. A sidearm was given as a retirement gift.
 - h. The next Seahorse open house will be on July 5.

- i. Verbal approval has been given for a replacement for Kenny McCain, and the position will be advertised.
- j. Three new bat house have been ordered, with one slated to replace the existing one at Refuge headquarters.
- k. Additional grants have been obtained for exotics removal so that program can continue in the fall.
- 4. Volunteer Hours. Allan Pither reported that he had provided the hours to Pam Darty.
- 5. Friends Science Monitoring Proposal. Russ Hall discussed his ideas for a science initiative which would involving assisting with monitoring water levels for the Minimum Flows and Levels program of the water management district. Some MFLs have been set, but not much is being done to monitor them—Friends members could help with this. For example, observations could be taken to record the impact of low water levels on sensitive habitats. Russ has identified some good areas for observation, including the freshwater pond with overlook, marsh areas which are moving landward, and Barnett Creek with transition zones. Useful data that Friends could collect include: depth, areal extent, salinity, flow, vegetation changes, and wildlife use which would be the most important factor to Friends. The goal would be to monitor and report only if substantial changes take place. Others are collecting data on rainfall, groundwater levels, river flows, weather, tides, ibis nesting, and bird counts. The needed volunteers would include 3 to 4 to develop the program with others called upon later. Although the overall timeline for seeing change may be 30-40 years, a baseline record of 10 years starting now would be useful. Tasks to be done include:
 - Identification of testing methods and protocols
 - Training of volunteers
 - Enhancement of quality by bringing in new expertise
 - Data management
 - Expansion of monitoring to other habitats

Comments of Board members included:

- This would be a good citizen science project to get people involved
- UF resources could be very helpful
- Lake Watch might provide a good model
- Should focus on what the Refuge is responsible for, i.e., relate impact of water issues on Refuge issues

Comments by Andrew Gude included:

- Need to check impact of logging roads on flood flows
- Need to identify what changes are needed
- He would like to have the surveys done soon
- All roads have been documented with connections to trails, sizes, etc.

Motion by Maria Sgambati that the Friends Board endorse the science initiative as presented by Russ Hall. **Second** by John McPherson. Passed by a unanimous vote.

- 6. Friends 2014 Initiatives. A handout had been provided by Greg Lang (attached) and the following updates were provided at the meeting:
 - a. Refuge Expansion: Andrew Gude reported that 200 acres south of Shell Mound Road will be added to the Refuge.
 - b. Big Bend Conservation Project: Andrew Gude reported that the WMD is going to take the lead, with FWC and several NGOs in support. Several groups have raised funds to do initial studies and are applying for a \$50,000 grant. The goal is to be both economically and environmentally beneficial to the counties affected. From the planning documents areas that should be protected by easements will be identified.
 - c. Art Initiative: Maria Sgambati reported that the artist in residence program has put out a call for artists.
 - d. Paddling Project: Distribution of panels continues, for example, to Brasingtons in Gainesville.
 - e. River Trail: Andrew Gude will be looking into ADA options.

7. Old Business:

- a. Cedar Key Kiosks. The kiosks will need to be removed, and there is some discussion of the possibility of putting the displays on the walls of the new restroom facilities.
- b. Update on New U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service Policy on Friends Organizations, and Agreement Template. Bob Hudson reported that work is progressing on this, with a big issue being liability: there is a need to identify activities where there may be liability and then to make sure that such activities are sponsored by the Refuge or Friends.

- d. National Wildlife Refuge Association. Bob Hudson reported that the dues had been paid.
- e. Seahorse Key Marine Lab Open Houses. Maria Sgambati said that it is very good to have the Friends table at the open houses. The next one is July 5, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Bob Hudson will talk to Carmelo about getting Friends materials to the island.
- 8. 2014 Friends Science Camp on Seahorse Key. Bob Hudson will ask Donna and Jay Bushnell if they want to spearhead again.
- 9. Springs Field School by Florida Springs Institute. Bob Hudson described this as a 2-3 day springs-related program with a cost of \$350. After discussion, it was decided that the Friends group should not pay to have a member participate due the tenuous connection to Friends activities and goals.
- 10. Treasurer Report. Attached and accepted by consensus.
- 11. Communication Report. Peg Hall provided a written report, attached, and reported that Bill Kilborn got the Barnett Creek Trail brochure printed. The Turkey Creek Trail brochure is now in the works, and the News Brief will be going out soon.
- 12. The Board agreed to not have a meeting in July due to many Board members not being able to attend.
- 13. The meeting was adjourned at 11:50 a.m.
